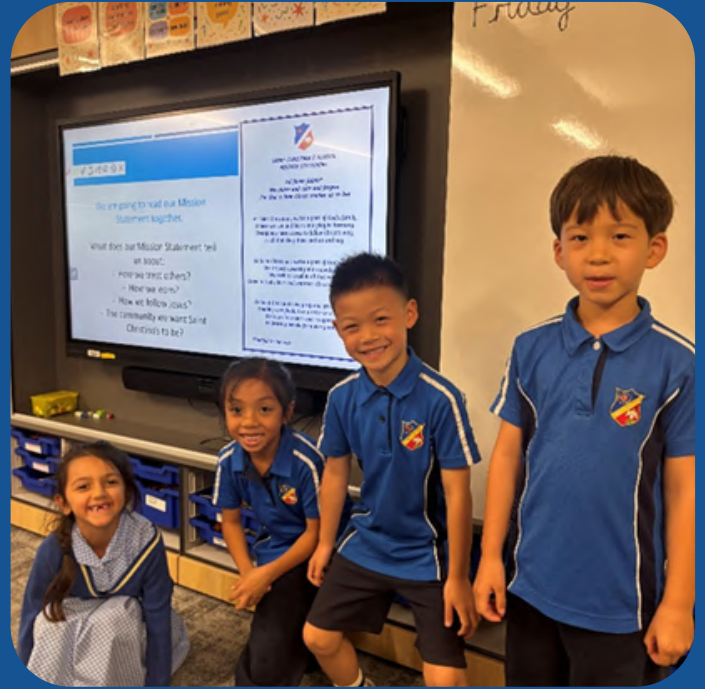

Dear Parents,

The highlight of my week was a simple one: a child in Reception being observed helping a child in Nursery. There was no adult direction and no expectation of recognition. The Reception child had seen that someone younger needed help and responded. What a very pure exchange. It captured the message at the heart of Friday's assembly: "Everybody can be great, because everybody can serve."

These words from Martin Luther King Jr. remind us that leadership is open to everyone. From our youngest children to our oldest, each person has something to offer. Leadership begins when we notice another person and choose to help.

During the assembly, our Year 6 prefects received their badges. They were appointed last term and are now beginning their responsibilities across the school. We also announced our elected School Council representatives, who will listen to the views of their classmates and advocate for them.

These are important positions, and we expect the children who hold them to lead through service, but, as we said in assembly, the badge does not create the leader. The exchange between those two young children was also leadership because it came from the heart; It came from empathy and a willingness to act.

The same idea connects with the results of our first Parents' Link questionnaire, a summary of which appears below this letter. You will read that the importance of community came through strongly. Parents value the sense of belonging at Saint Christina's and want opportunities to contribute to it.

There is still time to complete the **second questionnaire** ([Parents' Link Volunteer Questionnaire](#)) about the practical support you could offer during the year. We have received ten responses so far and would welcome, indeed need, more. You do not need to hold a formal position or make a year-long commitment. Helping with one event would still make a valuable contribution. Quite simply, these events depend on parents volunteering their time, and we need enough people willing to help make them happen.

Saint Christina's belongs to all of us. The strength of the community depends on each person feeling that they have a place within it and something to contribute. Some serve through an appointed role; others might notice a need and respond, as that wonderful Reception child did this week. Both make a difference.

Parents' Link Survey

Thank you to everyone who completed our recent Parents' Link questionnaire. We received 72 responses, which has given us a useful picture of what parents value and how PL might work this year.

There was strong support for the events PL provides for children and families. An overwhelming majority of respondents valued activities for children and highlighted the contribution PL makes to the wider school community. When asked about priorities for the future, 76% chose enjoyable events for children and families, with 63% identifying a welcoming and inclusive school community as important.

Fundraising came much lower down the list, with 8% selecting it as a main priority. This suggests that parents see PL primarily as a way of bringing families together and contributing to the life of the school with any additional funds raised through these activities providing an added benefit for the school and our children.

There is also a willingness to help, with 61% saying that they would be interested in helping with activities linked to their child's year group, 54% would be willing to help with occasional tasks from home and 49% would help with an individual event.

Time is clearly a factor. 72% of respondents identified work or other commitments as something that makes getting involved more difficult, and only 15% said that joining a regular organising committee would appeal to them.

There was no single majority view on the structure. The most popular option, chosen by 33%, was a small coordinating group with different parents helping with individual events. 24% preferred a regular parent committee, while 18% favoured the school taking more of the coordination, with parents volunteering for particular events.

The written comments were helpful, too. Parents want us to keep the events that have worked well, but there was also support for making it easier for more people to get involved. A number of parents mentioned communication, particularly knowing when help is needed and what that help involves.

We are now awaiting the results of the second questionnaire, which asks about parents' availability and the practical support they could offer at events during the year. The response so far has been limited, and we hope more parents will complete it by Monday. This will give us a realistic picture of what can be delivered before arrangements for the year are confirmed. There is still time to complete the questionnaire here:

The positive feedback about Parents' Link events reflects the considerable time and energy that parents have, and continue to give to the school, and we are grateful to all who have contributed. Thank you also to everyone who shared their views through the questionnaire and to those who have already offered to help. We now want to build on what has worked well and create the broadest tent possible so that parents can play a part in the year ahead.

Year 2

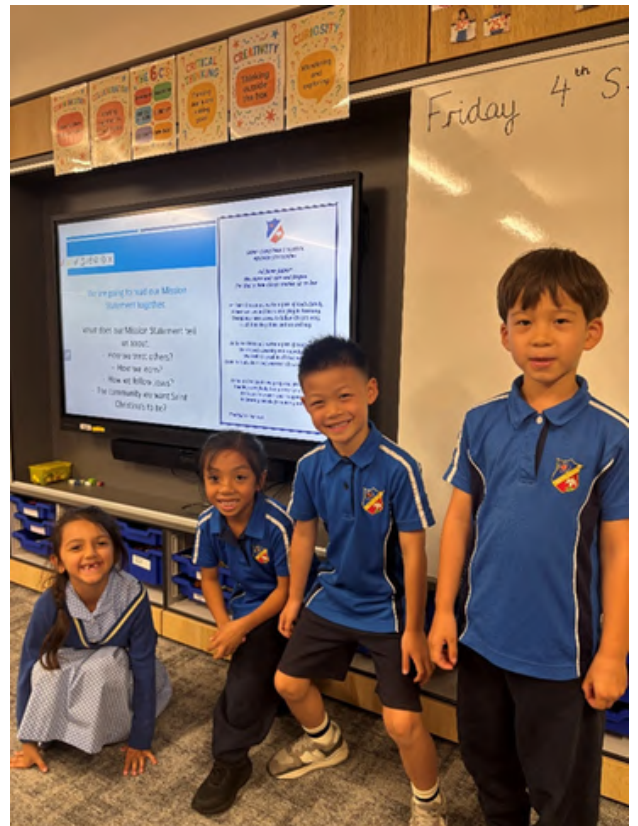
Year 2 have made a brilliant start to the new school year.

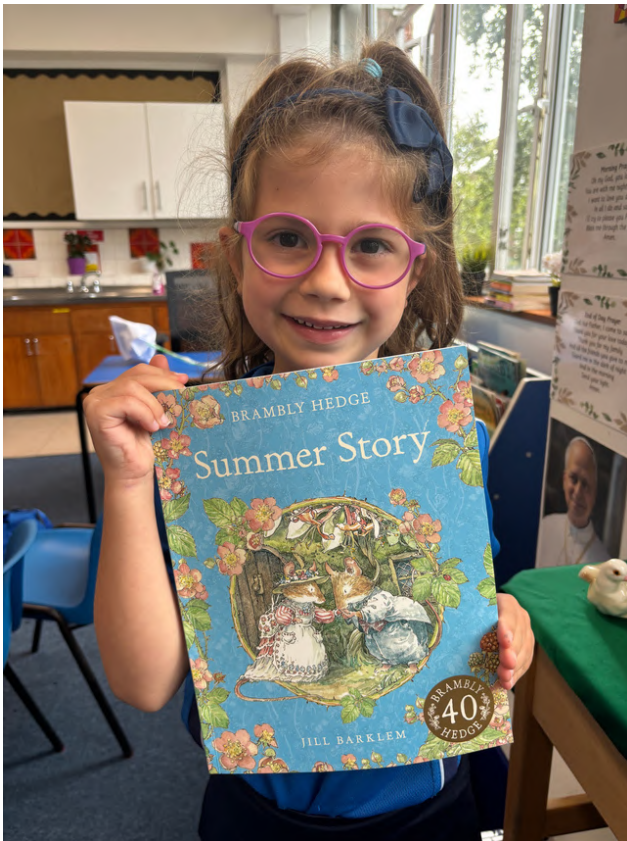

Year 4

This week in Year 4, we explored our Catholic Social Teaching focus of Care for Creation, using the Book of Genesis to identify features of the Garden of Eden in different artworks and beginning our new learning about Abraham. In History, we investigated what life was like in Ancient Egypt by analysing evidence from a tomb painting and creating timelines of key events. Our Art lessons saw us designing Egyptian cartouches using hieroglyphics, just as the Ancient Egyptians did to represent the names of royalty. In Maths, we continued developing our place value skills by representing and comparing numbers up to 10,000, while in English we made predictions about our new class text, *Secrets of a Sun King*, revised sentence punctuation and completed our first reading comprehension of the year. We also enjoyed our first research project presentations, with Nathaniel, Hedi, Leyla and Sameera doing a fantastic job, and held our class student council elections. Congratulations to Herb and Eloise, our newly elected Student Council Representatives, and well done to all the children who confidently presented their speeches to the class.

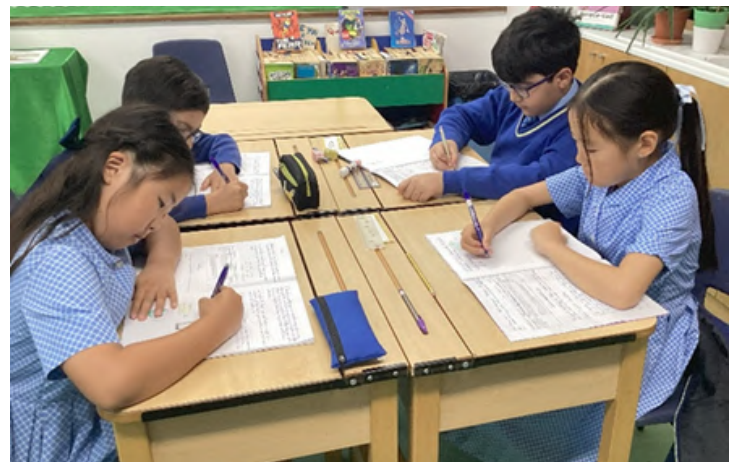

Year 6

Year 6 have enjoyed debating the question: Should we make big changes to the way we live in order to protect our planet? The children explored a range of sources and perspectives, using the information they gathered to generate thoughtful points for both sides of the argument. They then learnt how to structure a discursive piece of writing, presenting balanced arguments before reaching their own considered conclusion and using persuasive language effectively throughout.

This is a skill we will continue to develop each week through our Critical Thinking sessions. The children will take increasing ownership of these sessions, leading their own class debates by presenting arguments before opening the discussion to their classmates to question, challenge and deliberate. It has been wonderful to see the 6Cs in action, particularly Communication, Critical Thinking, Curiosity and Collaboration, as the children learn not only to express their own ideas clearly, but also to listen carefully to and consider the perspectives of others.

Latin Club

The Latin Club at Saint Christina's has now been running for over 20 years and is, as such, one of the longest running clubs in the school. Aimed at children in Years 5 and 6, we aim to familiarise children with basic Latin along with its structures, grammar and stories. A lively approach is taken, with children even performing drama skits in Latin when the occasion demands. We use the Minimus series, which introduces a family living in Roman Britain with details of their everyday lives; myths and legends also occur throughout the course of the book and would be the sort of myths that children would have learnt some two thousand years ago.

In addition to the skills associated with learning languages, children will also enrich their vocabulary by learning word derivations; and many of the skills associated with Verbal Reasoning are also encountered and practised in an interesting and enjoyable way.

Several of the ex-members of Latin Club have gone on to study Classics at University, and many of our members have found learning Latin at secondary school a whole lot more easy than those of their contemporaries who did not enjoy an early start in Latin.

Although the school clubs have already started, I am more than happy to take on any more late starters, should any of you be happy for your child to learn Latin at Saint Christina's.

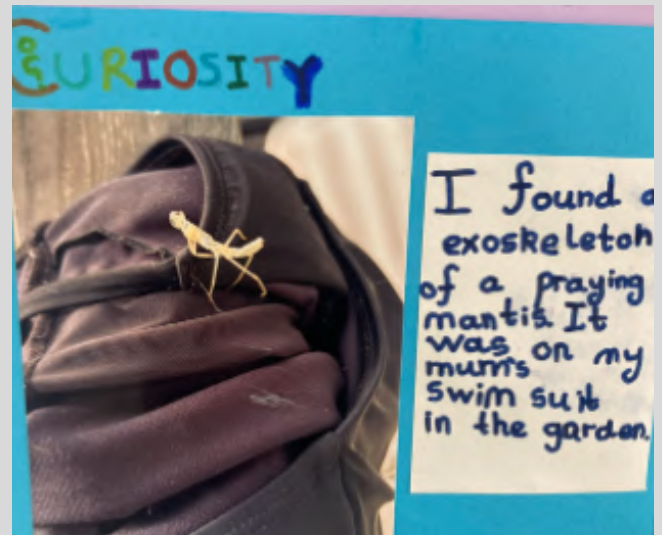

Each week we will find out about some of our new Year 6 prefects. This week is the turn of our 6C prefect Camilla.

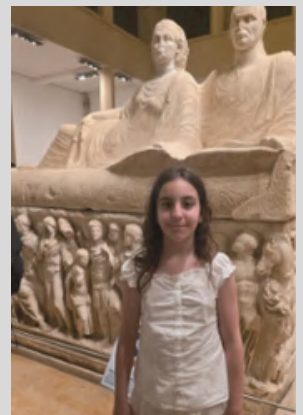
