Dear Parents,

Tell me it's December in a prep school without telling me it's December in a prep school. Singing everywhere, and the whole place feeling lighter for it. On Wednesday, when I walked into my philosophy lesson, Year 6 were halfway through "Silent Night". The entire week had the same rhythm with rehearsals in the music studio, Nativity practices in the hall, and songs drifting out of classrooms as children prepare for their performances. The Little Voices Choir in Years 1 and 2 brought real joy to their assembly, and when I caught up with Mr Hirst, he told me about Year 3 singing inside St John's Wood Tube Station to raise money for St John's Hospice and how proud he felt watching them. A week full of singing, and it has lifted the whole school.

There is solid evidence behind the impact of singing in schools. Recent research drawing on The Children's Society and university studies looked at daily group singing in primary classrooms. In one study, a group sang together for 20 minutes a day over two weeks. Before they began, around four in ten children in the study scored in the lower wellbeing range on a standard life-satisfaction scale. Afterwards, this dropped to around one in ten. The improvement was clear.

When researchers spoke to the children, three themes stood out. They said singing made them feel joyful and happy, they talked about the social side: singing with friends, feeling part of a team, knowing others would carry them if they lost their place. They also said it helped them switch off from worries and feel more settled. Regular group singing strengthened many of the things we care about in schools: positive emotion, connection, focus, and resilience.

Singing is part of the DNA of Saint Christina's; It shapes our liturgies, gives younger children a steady route into confidence, and it gives older children a way to lead. Anyone who has been to one of our Masses and heard the whole school sing "You Are Holy" in harmony will know what it does to a room. Look at the teachers and the parents and you will see that there is often not a dry eye in the house, including mine. Year 3 singing for the hospice this week sits in that same story. Purpose, community, and growth held together through song. All of this builds towards our Carol Concert and Nativities next week, which are always a highlight of the year. We look forward to seeing many of you there.

Have a good weekend when it comes.


The walk took place on Tuesday evening, in torrential rain, and both children completed it with huge determination and smiles on their faces.

Parent Workshop: The Alchemy of Self-Compassion: A Path to Richer, More Connected Parenting

We are exploring the possibility of hosting a parent workshop on The Alchemy of Self-Compassion, led by Caroline Hanson, a Compassionate Inquiry therapist, Conscious Parenting Educator, and mother of four. The workshop focuses on how the way we speak to ourselves shapes the way we show up for our children. It offers practical tools, gentle reflection and simple self-compassion practices that can support calmer, more connected parenting.

Caroline blends personal experience with evidence-informed approaches, helping parents explore their inner dialogue, reduce self-judgement and build a more intentional, grounded parenting toolkit. It's an opportunity to pause, reflect and consider how caring for ourselves strengthens how we care for our children.


Boxes of Love: Thank You!


Christmas Card Competition Winner




Year 1 Zoo Trip


The children revisited the scripture from Luke's Gospel and discussed John's mission to prepare people's hearts for Jesus, bring forgiveness, and shine God's light in the world.



Year 6




Music Update

KS2 Carol Service Preparation

We will be having a full run-through of the KS2 Carol Service next **Wednesday (10th December)** during the afternoon. Please encourage children to **continue learning words** so they are ready by this time. They will also need **instruments** if they play in the Orchestra, Brass Group or String Ensemble (and year 6 guitarists), and any music they normally bring with them.

Here are my top tips for learning song words:

- 1. Break the song down into **sections** and commit to learning one section or verse at a time.
- 2. Know what it's **about** this is better than trying to learn meaningless words. Can you summarise a verse in five words or less?
- 3. Read or sing the verse **out loud**, by yourself, several times looking at the words.
- 4. Cover it up and try again without looking how did you do?
- 5. Repeat steps 3 and 4 several times if needed.
- 6. Get an adult or friend to test you.
- 7. Keep at it **revise** it the next day to be sure.
