Year Six and Creative Thinking and Writing

For the first part of the term we have looked particularly closely at creative writing and applying our knowledge of this to writing cinquains.

Two of the more imaginative cinquains were written by Lara:

The waters: Perfect It's beautiful Crystal blue waters shine Pond or a river – they shine Perfect Sunset: Sunset Pink and orange Fluffy clouds in the sky As if the heavens are blooming Sunset

We also had a discussion on what it meant to have or be a best friend.

We considered how many best friends it was possible to have.

Sarah wrote a brief reflection on this, and reckoned that you could have as many best friends as you wanted, but you should be careful – if you made too many best friends, it could cause a fight!

What do you think? Is it worth discussing issues related to friendship with your children?

Mathematics in Year Six

We have spent the first two weeks of term with our principal focus on geometry. We started by calculating missing angles in a variety of figures, enabling us to practise working with vertically opposite angles, supplementary angles, and angle totals of different shapes. We went on to construct a variety of different 2D shapes, such as different types of triangles as well as polygons. Although this is outside of the syllabus, it was very pleasing to see several members of Year Six construct dodecagons, octagons, and so on.

We leave you with a challenge that provoked much discussion:

Can you have a quadrilateral that has three obtuse angles? Prove it!

The key messages which Year 3 shared were:

- 'Lamb of God' is a title for Jesus that tells us about His sacrifice for us.
- Jesus' sacrifice enables us to get closer to God.
- Spending time with Jesus, helps us to get to know Him.

They chose the hymn 'Here I am to Worship' which the whole Key Stage sang. It was a lovely worship – thank you Year 3. Next week we look forward to Year 5 leading the Collective Worship.

PE Update

The children have made a fantastic start to the term despite the cold weather. During this half-term, the children will experience a variety of sports, including gymnastics, football, and netball. The EYFS and Key Stage 1 classes will be spending time working through units of work focused on gymnastics and some coordination skills. In these sessions, the children will be working on the theme of balance and will be exploring different ways to move, including jumps, rolls, turns, and twists. The children have spent time working on different types of jumping and have applied these ideas onto low pieces of apparatus.



The Key Stage 2 classes will spend time on gymnastics whilst also continuing to develop their football and netball skills which we have worked on previously. The Year 5 and 6 classes have been working on their vaulting in gymnastics and in Year 5 and 6 we have been working on passing and moving in football and netball. We have several fixtures coming up over the next few weeks and the Year 6 girls have their first football tournament of the Year at the end of this half term.



The sporting clubs have once again proved popular and it has been lovely to see so many children signing up to join the clubs. At the end of last term, we welcomed David from Little Musketeers in to talk to us about fencing. Fencing club runs on Wednesday before school for Year 1 and 2 and after school for Key Stage 2. David spoke to us about the skills involved in fencing and taught everyone the En Guard position. He then demonstrated some of the games and activities they do in the club. There are still a few spaces available for the fencing clubs so if you are interested then please do refer to the club letter, which provides details of how to sign up.

REMINDERS / HEALTH & SAFETY

NUT FREE SCHOOL

We have a number of pupils and staff in the school who have serious nut allergies. Please will you ensure that you do not give your child any nuts or nut products (e.g. Nutella) to bring into school.

MEDICATION IN SCHOOL

Please do not send your child into school with any medication on their person. Medication can only be administered by qualified personnel. The only medication that we can administer, therefore, is prescribed medication e.g. Antibiotics, Inhalers, EpiPen's. Children should not be sent into school with any other type of medication e.g. Cold and Flu medicines / Calpol / Lozenges etc. If your child is unwell and in need of medication, they should remain at home until they feel better.

If your child does have prescribed medication, please contact Miss Georgia, and she will ask you to fill in the relevant forms and keep the medication safely in the School Office. Thank you for your co-operation.

Late collection of children

Children who are collected late at the end of the school day or after a club will be sent to Homework Club and parents will be charged accordingly. Homework Club runs from Monday to Thursday from 3.30-5.00pm and costs £15 per session. A late fee of £50 will be charged if children are collected after 5.00pm.

Items left in the front office

Please ensure that your child has everything they need for the school day before they arrive in the morning: e.g. snacks / PE Kit. Items are regularly being left in the office by parents and carers throughout the day and, whilst they will do everything they can to help you, this causes disruption not only to the office staff but also to the children, Class Teachers and TA's who have to come to the office to collect the items.
